Call to Worship

One: Let us dance and sing and shout for joy,

All: **As we wave our palm branches in celebration.**

One: Jesus told His disciples to go ahead of Him and to find a donkey for Him to ride as He entered Jerusalem.

All: **But the disciples were worried about how the crowd would react to Jesus' arrival.**

One: They need not have worried, for the crowds excitedly welcomed and praised Jesus for coming. They shouted,

All: **“Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.”**

One: Jesus sought peace not war, justice not anarchy. Let us join with the crowds as we sing and greet Jesus.

***Processional Song** “We Have a King” (sing through twice)

1. We have a King who rides a donkey, (sing 3 times)
and his name is Jesus.

2. Trees are waving a royal welcome, (sing 3 times)
for the King called Jesus.

3. We have a King who cares for people, (sing 3 times)
