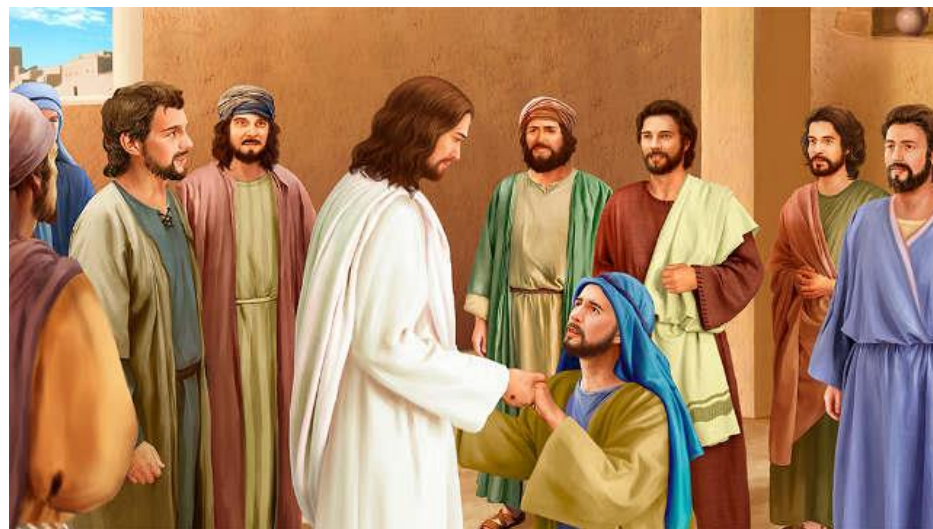
energy and our strength. May we be open to the risen Christ walking with us on life's journey. Amen.
