

Bayview/Cummer Exploration Teams' Activities Week Ending April 15, 2023

The activities of the Exploration Teams during the last two weeks involved the following:

□ Exploration Team continues to meet on a bi-weekly basis.

□ Ongoing discussions with Shining Waters Regional Council (SWRC) regarding the details of a framework acceptable to the Communities of Faith Commission. Draft report to the Commission is being developed.

□ Members of the Commission have asked for meetings with various groups/congregations at varying stages of the proposed amalgamation.

□ Chairs of Bayview and Cummer governing bodies met to discuss governance model and committee membership.

□ Job descriptions are being reviewed to ensure the needs of the new congregation will be addressed.

□ Discussions with SWRC regarding the administration of the Bayview property after June 30. Also, discussions with Toronto United Church Council occurred as they will be engaged by SWRC to manage the Bayview property if the amalgamation is approved. Tenant communications at Bayview are being addressed.

□ Financial needs of the new congregation are being forecasted for presentation to SWRC.

□ List of possible items to be relocated to Cummer from Bayview has been reviewed

□ T. Sullivan, Cummer's Director of Music Ministries, attended Bayview to assess the desirability of relocating pianos to Cummer. Decorte & amp; Co. Piano Services has been engaged to prepare a formal assessment.

□ J. D. Strachan, general contractor for 53 Cummer, has been asked to quote on the relocation of the stained-glass dome from Bayview to Cummer.

□ Discussions with TUCC regarding the forecast building costs of operating 53 Cummer.

□ Draft congregational report prepared outlining the findings and recommendations of the Exploration Teams.

□ Week of April 16 – Communities of Faith Commission meeting with Bayview representatives

□ April 23 at 10:00 a.m. - Joint worship service at Cummer

□ May 7 – Cummer building reopening celebration

□ Mid-May – Cummer congregational town hall meetings

 $\hfill\square$ May 17 – Approval of tentative agreement in principle with the Communities of Faith Commission

□ Late May - Written report and recommendations of the Exploration Teams distributed to the Congregations

□ June 11 – Separate Congregational Meetings to vote on the amalgamation

□ June 18 – Bayview decommissioning service

□ June 21 – Communities of Faith Commission final approvals
